The Childhood Trust is London's child poverty charity, dedicated to creating opportunities and brighter futures for the 700,000 children growing up in poverty across the capital.

Our work spans four key impact areas that shape our approach: providing funding, advice, and resources to strengthen charities based in London; delivering an active community outreach programme Transforming Spaces; and conducting research and advocacy to raise public awareness on child poverty in London. We are driven by the belief that every child deserves a healthy, happy, and safe childhood, one that prepares them for life and breaks the cycle of poverty.


Volunteers are essential to every part of our work. There are many ways in which people can get involved and contribute to our mission:
